The State of Vermont is the only designated Regional Center in the United States that is operated and supervised by a government department within the State - The Vermont Agency Of Commerce And Community Development (VACCD).

The Vermont Regional Center, operated by the state's Agency of Commerce and Community Development, provides foreign investors an attractive option for international investment through the EB-5 Visa Program.

Why EB-5 Investors Choose Vermont?

➔ Faster Approvals

Credibility of the State of Vermont with governmental responsibility and oversight means that investors' petitions are given priority by CIS, resulting in a faster path to approval.

➔ State Oversight

The Vermont Agency of Commerce and Community Development oversee and monitor EB-5 project activities in Vermont.

➔ Accountability

Formal written reports required by Vermont Agency of Commerce and Community Development every 90 days upon activities of the project.

➔ Compliance

Designated Vermont Agency of Commerce and Community Development Official to assure project's compliance with U.S. Immigration Law and regulations concerning investments within a regional center in the EB-5 Visa preference category.

➔ Credibility

One of the longest established Regional Centers since 1997 with close involvement of Senior State Senator, Patrick Leahy; Governor State of Vermont, Jim Douglas; and Vermont Secretary of State, Kevin Dorn.
